#### IMPORTANT NOTES:

- The following courses are not acceptable towards the ECON Minor: ECON300, ECON321, ECON386, ECON387, ECON396, ECON397, ECON399, ECON499.
- The Department of Economics strictly enforces all prerequisites. Note the following:
  - ECON325 is acceptable in place of ECON305, however ECON305 is NOT acceptable in place of ECON325.
  - ECON326 is acceptable in place of ECON306, however ECON306 is NOT acceptable in place of ECON326.
- Speak with an ECON Advisor to determine which statistics courses are acceptable. Examples include ECON230, ECON321, BMGT230, and STAT401. Note: STAT100 and STAT400 are **not** acceptable.
- A student may use a maximum of six credits (or two courses) to satisfy the requirements of both a major and minor.
- Courses completed for one minor may not be used to satisfy the requirements of another minor.
- No more than six of the required credits (or two courses) may be taken at an institution other than the University of Maryland, College Park (incl. AP/IB credits).
